

Citizens' Alert Pertaining to Missing Persons' Families Re: James Earl Forster – Impersonator

Information obtained from a *Regina Leader Post* story dated March 5, 2008, states that **James Earl Forster**, age 66, is wanted on a bench warrant in Regina, Saskatchewan. He failed to appear before a Judge on March 4, 2008, to face charges of *impersonation* of an RCMP officer and *giving false information* to a parent of a missing child between March 5 and September 10, 2007. Foster was released from custody with numerous conditions late November 2007. These *conditions* included reporting weekly to police, not to use computers or Internet and not to have contact with two women.

Forster, who calls himself “Pastor James”, is last known to be in the greater Ottawa area and last seen at the Walk4Justice Rally at Parliament Hill, Ottawa, Ontario, September 15, 2008 at approximately 3:30pm. At this Rally, Forster made contact with at least two family members of missing persons and advised that he purportedly had information on the unsolved cases. He stated that he is “Pastor James” and “the Patron Saint of Justice” and that he is a “messenger from God”. He says he receives messages from God as to what happened to missing women and children and he provides explicit unsubstantiated and false information. This false information caused great distress to the family members and this behavior is consistent with Forster’s prior behavior, which led to the charges described.

We citizens have reason to believe Forster is still utilizing computers and the Internet and is planning to travel with a partner, from Toronto to the northern part of Ontario, to contact family members of missing women. Forster claims the partner is a “brain surgeon who gave it all up to help family members find their loved ones.” Since James Forster has left Regina and relocated in Ontario, he could relocate anywhere for the express purpose of harassing the families of missing persons.

Please be aware that Forster is a fraud and that he is highly skilled at impersonating. Do not engage in conversation with “Pastor James” in the event that he approaches you or a family member of a missing person. Be cautious regarding your personal and contact information. Contact your local police department and tell them that he is wanted in Regina, Saskatchewan and provide information where Forster was last seen as well as the circumstances surrounding your meeting.
